IMG Definition	An International Medical Graduate (IMG) is a physician who has received a medical degree from a medical school outside of Canada or the United States.

Purpose	To ensure the trainee is progressing at the appropriate level of training based on their appointment, identify areas of concern, and determine if the trainee can continue training in the program.

Exemptions from PEAP/AVP	 Yes – if the resident has completed: one or more years of accredited residency training in Canada or the U.S entering a residency in the same specialty or a subspecialty within that discipline/field (check CPSO) Check the CPSO website for more information. Fellows may be eligible for exemption from the PEAP. The PGME Office will review applications once accepted and determine if exemption applies. 	No

Length of Training	 Minimum of 4-weeks Maximum of 12-weeks Can be extended up to an additional 4-weeks with the approval of the PGME Associate Dean and in accordance with PGME's PEAP Principles, Guidelines and Process Extension is not to be used for the purpose of remediation 	 12-weeks Can be extended an additional 6-weeks with the approval of the PGME Associate Dean and CPSO Can be extended an additional 6-weeks (up to a maximum of 12-weeks) with the approval of the PGME Associate Dean and CPSO; must be approved by the CPSO Registration Committee Extension can occur for the purpose remediation

Credit towards training	 Does not count towards training in a Royal College or CFPC accredited residency program. Does count towards completion of fellowship training. 	Successful completion counts towards training in a Royal College or CFPC accredited residency program
Failure of PEAP/AVP	The training appointment is terminated. The trainee cannot enter another PEAP in Ontario with the same appointment level in the same specialty, subspecialty, or fellowship.	The training appointment is terminated. The trainee cannot apply again to the same specialty at the same appointment level of entry. They may apply to a different specialty.
Appeal	Yes, subject to the conditions of the McMaster PGME Assessment of Learners and Appeals Policy.
